Interconnection Process Reform

Interconnection New Service requests have drastically increased over the past few years. The Interconnection Process Reform Task Force (IPRTF) will discuss challenges related to the interconnection process and look for opportunities to improve the process via the Consensus Based Issue Resolution (CBIR) process.

Problem Statement

Problem Statement/Issue Charge approved at Planning Committee on April 6, 2021

Issue Status

The IPRTF solution packages for a new interconnection process and solution packages to determine how PJM will transition to a new process have progressed through the Planning Committee.

Meetings to review the tariff language changes related to the PC-endorsed package were completed on April 8, 2022.

Target Completion

The IPRTF is expected to be completed in the second quarter of 2022.

Progress Update

The new process and transition packages, along with the OATT language updates, will be brought to the April 27, 2022 MRC and MC for a same day vote.
